Did you know that in 1921 the GFWC created the Indian Welfare Committee at the Salt Lake City Convention? Over the next several decades, GFWC clubwomen volunteered time and resources to improve the lives of Native Americans through scholarships and health programs and by promoting the economic viability of native arts and crafts thus helping to preserve their culture. The Umatilla Indian Reservation in Oregon hosted one of the early GFWC clubs, the Oregon Trails Woman's Club, which was founded by Elizabeth Bender Roe Cloud.
