### Women in History This Month

May 3, 1898 - Golda Meir (1898-1978) was born in Kiev, Russia. She was one of the founders of the modern state of Israel and served as prime minister from 1969 to 1974. May 12, 1820 - British nurse and public health activist Florence Nightingale (1820-1910)

was born in Florence, Italy. May 14, 1942 - During World War II, an Act of Congress allowed women to enlist for noncombat duties.

May 16, 1862 - Civil War Union General Benjamin Butler issued his "Woman Order" declaring that any Southern woman showing disrespect for Union soldiers or the U.S.

would be regarded as a woman of the town, or prostitute.

May 19, 1930 - African American playwright Lorraine Hansberry (1930-1965) was born in Chicago, Illinois. She is best known for A Raisin in the Sun (1959), a play dealing with prejudice and black pride.

May 20, 1932 - Amelia Earhart became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic. She completed a 2,026-mile flight in about 13 hours.

May 21, 1881 - The American Red Cross was founded by Clara Barton. The organization today provides volunteer disaster relief in the U.S. and abroad.

May 23, 1810 - Journalist Margaret Fuller (1810-1850) was born in Cambridgeport, Massachusetts. She became the first American woman to serve as a foreign correspondent.

May 26, 1878 - Interpretive dancer Isadora Duncan (1878-1927) was born in San Francisco. She revolutionized the entire concept of dance by developing a free-form style and

rebelled against tradition, performing barefoot in a loose fitting tunic.
