

Stroke F.A.S.T. Facts



Here are some quick facts about strokes in women.

If you think someone may be having a stroke, act **F.A.S.T.** and do this simple test:

F - FACE: Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop?

A - ARMS: Ask the

person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downwards?

S - SPEECH: Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Is their speech slurred or strange?

T - TIME: If you observe any of these signs, call 911 immediately.

Note when the symptoms were first noticed. Stroke damage can be reduced by an FDA approved clot-buster medication if it is administered within 3 hours.

With these facts, you can help to save lives.

And remember, everyone is responsible for selling tickets




